MINUTES CITY BOARD OF EDUCATION CITY OF MUSCLE SHOALS, ALABAMA

The City Board of Education of the City of Muscle Shoals, Alabama, met for the Board's

regular meeting in the office of the City Superintendent of Education of the City of Muscle Shoals,

Alabama, on November 17, 2022, at approximately 6:18 p.m. The meeting followed a work session

held at 5:30 p.m. The secretary called the roll with the following results:

Also present were Chad Holden, Superintendent and ex-officio Secretary to the Board and

custodian of its minutes and records, and Kelli Nichols, Assistant Superintendent. Administrators

present included Sheneta Smith, Wes Pounders, Jason Simmons, Britney Schneider, Diana Ritter,

and Kevin Davis. Also present were Supervisors Todd Meckes and Richard Templeton. Alabama

Education Association representative, Tracy Moore, and Muscle Shoals Education Association

President, Chris Porter, were in attendance. Other guests included several students from the

Muscle Shoals High School Band, their parents, and band directors.

Board President, Dr. Celia Rudolph, declared a quorum present and the meeting duly and

legally constituted and open for the transaction of business.

A motion to approve the November 17, 2022, agenda was made by Dr. Davis and seconded

by Mrs. Allman. No discussion followed and the motion was subsequently approved with five yes

votes.

Dr. Rudolph asked Dr. Holden if any correspondence had been received that he would

like to share with the Board. Superintendent Holden stated he did not have correspondence to

share.

Superintendent Holden stated the next item on the agenda was a video presentation

highlighting achievements from Muscle Shoals Middle School.

Muscle Shoals High School Marching Trojan Band members and directors were

recognized and presented a resolution in honor of an outstanding 2022-2023 marching season

which resulted in the band being named the 2022 Class 6A Alabama State Marching Band

Champion. The resolution is shown at the end of these minutes.

Dr. Rudolph proceeded with the meeting agenda.

I. Business Action Items

Superintendent Holden read the following resolution regarding Consent Agenda action items:

Consent Agenda Resolution

For the consent agenda, the Board has been furnished with background material on each item or has discussed the item at a previous meeting. Consent Agenda items will be acted upon with one vote without discussion. If a Board member wants to discuss any item, it will be pulled from the Consent Agenda and voted on separately.

- A. Dr. Holden recommended approval of the following Consent Agenda items:

A motion to approve the superintendent's recommendation was made by Mrs. Allman and seconded by Mr. Wood. No discussion followed and the superintendent's recommendation was approved by five yes votes.

- B. Dr. Holden recommended approval of the Resolution for Warrant Purchase Agreement. A motion to approve the superintendent's recommendation was made by Mr. Wood and seconded by Mr. King. No discussion followed and the superintendent's recommendation was approved by five yes votes.
- C. Superintendent Holden recommended the Board approve the agreement to purchase real property (1500 East Avalon Avenue, Muscle Shoals, Alabama). A motion to approve the superintendent's recommendation was made by Mr. King and seconded by Dr. Davis. No discussion followed and the superintendent's recommendation was approved by five yes votes. Dr. Holden stated the property approved for purchase is the Summit Shoals Church/Daycare. The 20,000 square foot building sits next to McBride Elementary/Muscle Shoals Middle School and was previously known at the First United Methodist Church. In 2020, the Board purchased the vacant lot behind the church so with this addition, the Board of Education now owns the property from Avalon to Trojan Drive. It is a good property investment the school system will utilize in the near future.

Dr. Holden recommended consideration of an addition to Board Policy 6.1, *Admissions and Attendance*. The new section 6.1.6 is entitled *Students Charged with Serious Crime*. Mr. King asked for a motion to approve the superintendent's recommendation which was seconded by Mr. Wood. In discussion, Dr. Holden explained the policy was drafted by the school board attorney and it was recommended school boards consider the policy. Dr. Davis followed with a motion the policy be tabled until the next regular meeting to allow time for consideration by stakeholder groups. The tabling motion was seconded by Mrs. Allman. The tabling motion was subsequently approved by five yes votes. The policy section is shown at the end of these minutes.

E. Personnel Report

- The Muscle Shoals Middle School cheerleaders placed second in the AHSAA North Super Regional Cheerleading Competition.
- Congratulations to seniors, Trey Stoddard and Cayla Smith for being named high school Heisman award recipients.
- The Trojan football team continues to battle in the AHSAA playoffs. The team will travel to Gardendale for Round 3 on Friday night.
- Schools will be closed November 21-25 for Thanksgiving break.
- The superintendent expressed condolences to the family of CNP employee, Kelly Uhlman, who passed away suddenly last Friday. Kelly worked in the Child Nutrition Program at McBride/MSMS and most recently served as the cafeteria manager at Howell Graves Preschool. Kelly was a great employee and an even greater person. She will be missed.

The following sections would be added to the end of Policy 6.1.

Draft Policy:

6.1.6 – Students Charged with Serious Crime

- a. <u>Placement</u> If a student is arrested for non-school-related crimes, he or she may be placed in an alternative setting or on an alternative education plan during the pendency of the criminal process against the student. When the Superintendent or a designee learns of pending non-school-related criminal activity of a student, the Superintendent or designee shall work with the student's school's administration to determine an appropriate school placement. Identified students will not be allowed back on any school property until the appropriate placement is determined.
- b. <u>Length of Placement</u> The student's placement will run concurrently with the pendency of the criminal charges against the student. If the student is placed at an alternative school for a period longer than the end of the current school year, the student's placement at the alternative school will be reevaluated prior to the commencement of the next school year.

c. Notice of Serious Criminal Activity -

- 1. By Court or Law Enforcement The court or law enforcement may notify the Superintendent or designee of any student's arrest. The Superintendent or designee will notify the principal of the student's arrest.
- 2. By Parent If a student is charged as an adult or is alleged to have committed a serious crime, as identified below, regardless of age, his/or her parent/guardian should contact the School Principal to determine appropriate school placement during this time.
- d. Examples of Serious Criminal Activity For purposes of this policy, a serious crime includes, but is not limited to, any crime for which a student is charged as an adult; any crime committed using Deadly Physical Force or with a Deadly Weapon as those terms are defined in Ala. Code § 13A-1-2; and any crime resulting in Physical Injury or Serious Physical Injury as those terms are defined by Ala. Code § 13A-1-2. The ultimate decision about the seriousness of the crime rests with the Superintendent or designee.
- e. <u>Protection of Special Education Students</u> Any decision to assign a student to an alternative setting shall include a review and consideration of the student's exceptional status and any applicable federal and state law requirements or procedures.

f. Privacy of Student Information -

- 1. Any information received by a teacher, counselor, administrator, or other Board employee pertaining to a student's pending criminal activity shall be received in confidence for the limited purpose of rehabilitating the student and protecting students and staff at all schools. Such information shall not be further disseminated by the teacher, counselor, or administrator, except insofar as communication with the child, his or her parent, legal guardian, legal custodian, law enforcement personnel, and the juvenile probation officer of the student is necessary to effectuate the rehabilitation of the student or to protect students and staff at all schools.
- 2. All information received relating to a student's pending criminal activity shall be kept separate and apart from the student's educational record and shall be accessible only by the Superintendent or designee or the student's principal. Such information shall be destroyed when the student is no longer enrolled in the school district.
